Boosting media literacy and creativity

Part of the Mellon-funded Data Fluencies Project, our program is designed for high school students to critically and creatively engage with algorithmic and Al tools across a variety of media.





The Data Fluencies Theatre Project at Emerson College is part of a Mellon-funded multiinstitutional project based out of the Digital Democracies Institute at Simon Fraser University (Vancouver, Canada) investigating the impacts of dis/misinformation on society in order to better engage with our datafilled world. Students will have access to resources and expertise from the broader Data Fluencies Project, giving them a chance to learn from and collaborate with experts in the field. They will also have the opportunity to attend a multimedia performance engaging with AI in the Spring 2025.



THE PROGRAM

Throughout the Fall 2024 semester, ten to fifteen high school students will meet once a month to explore the possibilities, limitations, and impacts of Al. They will critically engage with algorithmic and Al tools and create artistic works across a variety of media, from music and sound to theatre and dance, visual art, and more.



Students will learn to...

- analyze and interpret various types of media.
- evaluate algorithmic and Al tools and their output.
- exercise problem solving and creative thinking.
