Seth Grue

When asked to name his favorite aspect of serving as the associate director of residence life at Emerson, Seth Grue didn't hesitate a moment before saying "the students." Clearly, this was an easy question for him to answer.

For the past nine years, Grue has worked closely with students, hiring and training all of the resident assistants (RAs) in Housing and Residence Life. He describes himself as fortunate to be working with such "passionate, dedicated, and focused young people." In addition to his hiring and training duties, Grue manages the programming and learning communities within the residence halls.

Both of Grue's parents are from Somerville; they currently live in New Hampshire, where they raised him. Grue attended Roger Williams University and majored in marine biology. Although he loved the subject and still does, he "couldn't take the solitary nature of research" and ended up turning to residential life as he worked as an RA during his



undergraduate years and enjoyed it. He then attended the University of Texas at Austin to earn his master's in higher education administration and served as a hall coordinator. He worked in the honors halls, which he describes as incredible. After graduating, he worked for the Department of Housing at Georgia Tech.

Grue returned to Boston to be near family. He was excited by the prospect of working at Emerson, a school he had heard excellent things about. Incidentally, he did quite a bit of acting in college—enough that he was only one credit short of minoring in it. So he was particularly drawn to Emerson because of its strong emphasis on the arts.

When not working, Grue can often be found remodeling or making small alterations to his home in Brighton. He attributes this interest to his father, who is "a fixer." He also enjoys long walks; he once walked the full six miles from his office to his home.

Grue spoke with pride of a former student employee who approached him before graduation and told him that he considered himself a changed person as a result of his RA experience. Grue noted that moments such as this are a wonderful bonus of what he does and confirms its importance. "The interactions with diverse people...the opportunity to help someone get through a difficult time" are additional reasons why he enjoys his job.

Grue has found his niche; indeed, he found it early in life and is aware of how fortunate he's been to pursue it in such vibrant and dedicated student communities. We at Emerson are equally fortunate to have him.



Emersonians Compete in Boating Contest

The Emerson Lions Dragon Boat Team made its fourth appearance at Boston's Annual Dragon Boat Festival on June 8 and 9. Emerson joined 54 teams from corporations, clubs, and colleges all over New England to compete in the 34th annual traditional Chinese paddling competition.

Dragon boat racing, which features a team paddling a 40-foot-long boat to the beat of its drummer, is one of the fastest growing water sports in North America—and one suited to Emerson. Not only does the 2,000-year-old tradition of dragon boating commemorate the death of a poet (Chinese poet Qu Yuan) but it is known as the "ultimate team sport," since synchronicity is much more important than strength. A perfectly synchronized team can beat a more conventionally athletic, but less coordinated, team.

This year, Emerson's co-ed team was made up of 17 fun-loving Emerson staff, students, and faculty of different ages, fitness levels, and backgrounds. Although the team did not walk away with a trophy this year, members were happy with their overall performance and are looking forward to next year's event.

The Emerson Lions team was led by Maureen Tripp, team captain and Iwasaki Library media resources coordinator. Participating staff were: Christina Zamon (Iwasaki Library), Mary Ann Cicala and Chris Serwacki (Alumni

"Sustainable Emerson" is a new section dedicated to sharing news about the College's sustainability efforts as well as tips and resources to help "green" your office environment.

This spring, Emerson was named the 2012–2013 Champion of the Great Northeast Athletic Conference (GNAC) in the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency's College and University Green Power Challenge. Emerson beat its GNAC rivals by using 12 million kilowatt-hours of green power, representing 100 percent of the school's annual electricity usage. The College purchases renewable energy certificates from Community Energy, which helps to reduce the environmental impacts associated with the campus's electricity use.
