Johanna Acevedo

If you have paid a bill at Emerson College, she has helped you. Johanna Acevedo works in Accounts Payable as an accounts payable specialist. Her duties entail the processing of expense reports, consultant payments, and invoices. Her department works closely with outside vendors to ensure that payments get made and maintains good working relationships with vendors. Having worked at Emerson for eight years, she enjoys the work environment and the people.

Before arriving at Emerson College, Acevedo was a teller manager for the University Credit Union. A graduate of Snowden International High School on Newbury Street in Boston, she has lived in Boston all her life, but her family is of Puerto Rican descent.

Acevedo has taken classes at Suffolk University and is pursuing an undergraduate degree in Communication Studies at Emerson. One class that she loved, the History of Dance, touches on a personal passion of hers. As a girl, she took dance classes, and now she coordinates a dance program for girls on a volunteer basis. She and her sister Syreeta founded, direct, and do all the teaching and choreography for a free girls' dance program based out of Boston's South End for girls aged 12–16.

The dance troupe, called the South End "ShowStopperz" Dance Team, dances a variety of music from hip-hop to Afro-Caribbean. Its repertoire includes many Latin dances such as merengue; bachata; and plena, which is a traditional Puerto Rican folkloric dance. "We introduce our Latin culture to the girls while also staying modern," Acevedo said.

The team is sought after to perform at many well-known, widely attended local events such as the St. Patrick's Day Parade in South Boston, the Boston Gay Pride Family Day in Faneuil Hall, and many Latin festivals. Acevedo and her sister manage all of the fundraising for the program—from bake sales to family bingo nights—to cover expenses such as costumes and shoes to keep the program free for all participants. Recently, the girls also had some acting lessons. Acevedo invited co-worker Matthew Finn in the Office of Academic Affairs, who performs in community theater productions, to lead some acting workshops over the summer.

The South End ShowStopperz Dance Team began in 2007 with only four girls. There are currently 12, and all are inner-city youth from the South End, South Boston, Mattapan, Hyde Park, and Dorchester. One reason the two sisters decided to start this program was to give back to their community. Acevedo said, "It's a very positive environment to be a part of. Performing is just a plus! It's about helping create and inspire these girls to be outstanding women in our society."

Many staff are involved in professional organizations. Through their memberships, they take advantage of opportunities to collaborate with peers from different institutions. Some gain leadership experience by heading sub-committees and planning conferences. Here are just a few examples of staff who collaborate, learn, and lead in local and national professional organizations.

Christina Zamon (Iwasaki Library) is a member of three different archiverelated organizations: the Society of American Archivists (SAA), the New England Archivists (NEA), and the Academy of Certified Archivists. She participates in these organizations to learn new skills and network with other archivists.

She especially enjoys networking with local colleagues from NEA because it allows her to "create partnerships between institutions to leverage educational opportunities and assistance with projects or research."

Zamon has held a number of leadership roles throughout the years. Most recently, she was the co-chair of the NEA's Spring 2013 meeting, which was its 40th anniversary meeting. She has also served on other committees, led meetings, and given presentations.

Josh Hamlin and Sharon Duffy (Student Life) are members of the Association of College Unions International (ACUI). It was due to their involvement that Emerson hosted the College Union Poetry Slam Invitational in 2010. Hamlin has also hosted sessions for recent regional and national ACUI conferences. Hamlin said of ACUI, "[It's] a great organization in which to share ideas, resources, and discussions on the operational management of student unions or campus centers."

Duffy has also been a member of the National Association of Student Personnel Administrators (NASPA) since graduate school. She has attended regional and national conferences, and has presented at a national conference. For the last four years, she has reviewed and evaluated program proposals for the national and regional education sessions presented at conferences.

A number of Human Resources staff are members of the Society for Human Resource Management (SHRM). Allegra Sandak is a member of SHRM and four other professional organizations. The memberships give her "access to the latest research and best practices, and to other individuals who focus on the same professional areas of interest [that I do]," she said.

Gary Walling (Development and Alumni Relations) is a member of the Council for Advancement and Support of Education (CASE), the Association of Professional Researchers for Advancement (APRA), and the New England Development Researchers Association (NEDRA). He attends annual conferences and virtual seminars for continuing education, networking, and informational purposes. He was on a planning committee for a symposium at this year's annual APRA conference.

Andy Tiedemann (Communications and Marketing) is the co-chair of the 2014 District I Conference in Boston.
