Staff Profile

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Anne Doyle

As executive director of academic administration in Academic Affairs, Anne Doyle works with students, faculty, and administrators across the College. She oversees the Academic Advising Center and the Lacerte Family Writing and Academic Resource Center, and personally advises about 50 undergrads each year.

Doyle works closely with the academic deans and department chairs, providing information on faculty, course enrollments, and

curricular planning. She supervises the production of the course catalogues annually.

Doyle started at Emerson as an administrative assistant in 1986. A year later, she was hired as coordinator of advising and was asked to create an academic advising system for the College.

The Advising Center was created in her second year. She was its only staff member at that time and was supported by graduate students who served as advising assistants to faculty advising first-year students.



Soon after starting at Emerson, she enrolled in the Speech Communication graduate program and graduated in 1990.

Doyle became director of academic advising in 1997 when the new Advising Center opened and moved to her current position in Academic Affairs in 2000.

Doyle's favorite aspect of her job is working with students. She enjoys their individuality and desire to take advantage of all Emerson has to offer.

During the academic advising period every semester, Doyle's colleagues notice that she "lights up." She especially loves to help a student figure out how he or she can "study abroad, spend a semester in LA, and squeeze in a double major or minor program."

Another reason that Doyle enjoys working at Emerson is her fellow staff members. "There are a number of people who have been here as long as I have," she noted.

She found excellent mentors in president emerita Jackie Liebergott and current Performing Arts faculty Mary Harkins, who "helped me find the passion for academic administration."

Doyle was born in Long Island, New York, but her parents moved the family to Vermont when she was young. She stayed in Vermont for college, graduating with a health education degree from the University of Vermont.

After college, she headed west. She worked at a dude ranch in Colorado for three years. Her next stop was the Greek island of Spetses, where she worked as a nanny for two-and-a-half years. She remains close to the family to this day.

New Faces Spotlight

Mark Wallace was recently hired as a seasonal assistant front-of-house coordinator for ArtsEmerson, but he has been working in a similar capacity as temporary staff since 2010.

His job entails front-of-house management as well as administrative tasks. He and three house supervisors share the role of house manager for the 20+ events per week that take place at the six venues around campus. The house manager for an event directs the front-of-house usher team, liaises with box office and production staff, tracks attendance figures in the event of an emergency evacuation, and resolves audience member questions and concerns, among other duties.

Before every performance, Wallace generates notes for the house supervisor and ushers to ensure that the event runs smoothly. The notes include details such as a description and synopsis of the performance, curtain time, performance run time, late seating policy, audience advisories, and post-performance activities.

Wallace also hires and trains ushers; there are currently 100 active ushers employed by ArtsEmerson.

Having spent many years working at theaters in London's West End (where many theaters traditionally run the same show for years), Wallace enjoys the variety of programming at ArtsEmerson's venues. The venues showcase both Emerson student performances and performances by visiting companies from around the world.

Wallace grew up in Worcester, England, and moved to London to study dance at the Rambert School of Ballet and Contemporary Dance when he was 16 years old. He danced professionally for about eight years, performing with dance



companies throughout Europe. He eventually transitioned to front-of-house work in a number of London theaters.

He met his wife, Ashley, during her study abroad semester in London. Once they had their first child a little over five years ago, they decided to move to the States to be closer to her family. They live with their daughter, Aurelia, and son, Tony, in Attleboro, Massachusetts.

Sustainable Emerson

RecycleMania Recap

RecycleMania 2014 results are in! Emerson increased our diversion rate from 17 to 30 percent this year, beating our pre-event goal of 25 percent. We came in 113th place out of 256 schools competing nationwide.

More than 400 students, faculty, and staff signed our online recycling pledge. In terms of amounts recycled during the competition, we recycled 79,923 pounds of general recycling (glass, metal, plastic, paper, and cardboard); 35,926 pounds of organics for composting; and 4,504 pounds of electronic waste.

To close out the competition, Emerson staged its first-ever Recycled Art Competition. Fourteen students submitted a fantastic variety of sculpture and wall hangings. Jacob Hines won first place,

Lauren Feeney won second place, and Tim Johnson won third place. Tyler Salomon and Naomi Ibasitas received Honorable Mention. Special thanks to Bob Fleming and the Iwasaki Library staff for hosting the event, President Pelton for making the presentations to the winners, and all of the judges: Bob Fleming, Christina Zamon, Sharon Duffy, Suzanne Hinton, Joe Ketner, Ashley Kelley, Kara McGee, and Julia Gutierrez.

Student Moveout Program

In order to address the large amount of material that is left behind by residents upon moveout from the residence halls, this year Campus Sustainability is partnering with Facilities, Housing and Residence Life, and Student Life along with Philadelphia-based Community Recycling (co-owned by Emerson parent Jackie Arch) to offer a comprehensive textile reuse program. We will use special bags to collect clothing from Emerson's 1,900+ residents as they vacate the residence halls this spring.

The clothing will be sent to domestic shelters and other charities as well as overseas to countries such as Africa and Central America, where it can have a profoundly meaningful role in people's lives. Community Recycling will send a check to Emerson based on the amount of material collected and Emerson will in turn donate the money to St. Francis House.

Work Smarter

Expense Report Reminders

- 1. Remember to have your paperwork signed by the appropriate approver.
- 2. Remember to include your complete FOAPAL.
- 3. Remember to attach original receipts.
- 4. Remember that you cannot be reimbursed for travel (airline/train/bus/car) in advance.
- 5. Remember that you cannot be reimbursed for expenses that are more than 90 days old.
- 6. Please state your business purpose for the incurred expenses.

- 7. Per diem rates are set by the IRS. Please note that there is a 25 percent per diem adjustment for the first and last day of travel.
- 8. Per IRS guidelines, mileage should be reimbursed from the shorter distance of the employee's house or from Emerson College to the business destination.
- Only submit numerical expense reports and check requests. All forms are available through the EC Print Copy Center.

Please note that we are reviewing our current policies and will update the Emerson community of any changes.
